**Paul Winter To Perform With The Common Ground Community Choir at
Friends Central School On Sunday, May 7th at 3 pm**

Paul Winter, multiple Grammy winning saxophonist, composer will be performing with The Common Ground Community Choir at Friends' Central School on Sunday, May 7th. Paul Winter's music has long embraced the traditions of many cultures, interweaving diverse instruments and elements with voices from what he refers to as "the greater symphony of the Earth", including wolves, whales, eagles, and several dozen other species of "wilderness musicians". The occasion of Mr. Winter's upcoming performance at Friends' Central is an event honoring the second anniversary of the Common Ground Interfaith Fellowship, a Bryn Mawr based non-profit organization that hosts monthly multi-cultural events where people of all world views, religions, races and cultures can come together to learn from each other and create deeper understanding and goodwill in our community.

Common Ground's theme for its second anniversary Sacred Space Celebration will be "The Heart of Community", and the keynote speaker will be author, attorney and international peace advocate, Jonathan Granoff. One of Common Ground's founding visionaries, Mr. Granoff works tirelessly as President of the Global Security Institute and as Co-Chair of the American Bar Association's Committee on Arms Control and National Security, to reduce the profound threat to our world that continues to be posed by nuclear weapons, and to remind us that love is the ultimate nuclear power. He lectures worldwide on the legal, ethical, and spiritual dimensions of human and social development.

Common Ground's anniversary program will include performances by Ugandan recording artist and peacemaker, Samite, members of the Native Nations Dance Theater, and Philadelphia singer/songwriter Phil Roy, who's songs have been recorded by Ray Charles, Aaron Neville, Mavis Staples and others. There will also be a joint performance with The Common Ground Community Choir and an all-female African percussion ensemble.

Common Ground's programs are offered as a free community service and all are welcome. The Sunday, May 7th Anniversary Celebration begins at 3 pm in the main auditorium at Friends' Central School, 1101 City Line Ave. (between Lancaster Ave. and Haverford Ave.) Daycare for children three and older is provided, and refreshments will be served from 5 pm to 6 pm.
